# WELCOME TO OUR NEW PASTOR!



The FPCL Pastoral Nominating Committee is so pleased to share that we have selected the Reverend Jonathan Murray to be the next Head Pastor for First Presbyterian Church of Littleton!

Jonathan most recently served as Co-Pastor of Covenant Presbyterian Church, College Station, Texas, alongside his spouse the Reverend Caressa Murray. They equally shared the responsibilities of preaching in the pulpit, moderating

session, overseeing committees and staff, pastoral care, worship leadership, and teaching. As partners in life, ministry, and parenthood, Jonathan and Caressa look forward to following where God leads each of them as they pursue individual calls to ministry in Colorado.

Jonathan has 14 years ordained experience and 21 years of professional ministry. Jonathan graduated from Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary, Austin, TX, in 2008 with a Master of Divinity. In October 2009, Jonathan was called as Pastor to St. Paul's Presbyterian Church, Needville, TX, and served until August 2014. He created a ministry for children based on Godly Play, expanded the middle and high school youth program, and led several new mission endeavors and summer trips.

Jonathan was then called by Covenant Presbyterian Church, College Station, TX, as Designated Pastor – a term that describes a two-year contract that can open to an installed pastoral relationship or be dissolved. Through discernment and prayer of Jonathan and the PNC, a new possibility opened for Jonathan and Caressa to serve as Co-Pastors. After 6 ½ years, we clarified the vision and values through the session and a strategic planning team seeking to claim the identity of this body of Christ. When Jonathan began in September 2014, his two children doubled the number of youth and children. When they left in October 2023, the youth group was thriving and the children's area in the sanctuary was overflowing with young families. During the clergy couples' ministry at Covenant, the church created new ministries for children, tweens, youth, college students, and for families with young children such as "Kids on a Mission" – a once-a-month Sunday afternoon that puts mission in the kids' hands through understanding bible stories of what Jesus did to serve a need.

Jonathan has served as keynote speaker at two youth conferences: in 2016, at Junior High Jubilee at Mo Ranch Presbyterian Conference, Hunt, TX, and in 2022, at SYNOD of the Sun Youth Workshop, Tulsa, OK. He was a clergy member of Faith Leaders for Justice Group of Bryan College Station, who work for food security, affordable housing, voters rights, and other justice issues in the community.

Jonathan will join First Pres on Sunday, January 7, 2024 to be formally introduced to the congregation and deliver the sermon. Immediately following, there will be a congregational meeting to approve Jonathan's terms of call. Jonathan will "officially" become the Head Pastor of First Pres on Monday, January 8, 2024.



Interim Pastor Bill Johnson will continue to lead, guide, and shepherd First Pres through Advent and Christmas. An interim pastor's role is to support the congregation in identifying its mission and purpose as the body of Christ during a time of transition and into the future and help prepare the congregation for new pastoral leadership. Pastor Bill has done so much more than this. He has been our congregation's rock and beacon of hope during our time of uncertainty. He has stood by us, entertained us, comforted us, and prayed with us as we have discerned what is next for First Pres. With the support of Pastor Bill, God has pointed us to Jonathan. Thank you and bless you Bill!

The PNC wants to thank you all for your patience during our journey to find a new pastor. We are so grateful and eager to have you meet Rev. Jonathan Murray on January 7 when he will be at church for a "meet and greet", and then when he first preaches on January 8. God has blessed us!

Thank you also to Elinor Packard, who on the typical weekday spends a lot of time going up and down the stairs to answer the door, and give out items to our friends in need! 

#### **Dollars and Sense – A Word from Finance**

Wow – 140 years!!! How many other institutions can you think of in your everyday life that have been around for 140 years?

First Pres must be doing something right. Perhaps it's our outreach to our neighbors with Community Dinners, Vacation Bible School, and help for the needy and homeless. Perhaps it's our overseas missions who help people that we will never know or see with often the very basics of life. Perhaps it's the warmth, inspiring music, and personal value of our Sunday morning services. Perhaps it's making the world a better place through the teachings of Jesus.

There are additional clues in the photo albums on display in Chandler Hall – the festive wedding pictures, tiny babies receiving their baptism, or perhaps a celebration of life for one of our departed. There are happy tables sharing a potluck, groups engaged in Bible study, or a picnic with games in the park. And there are the photos of the just-folks who gave their time and talent to "make First Pres go" over the years.

For any or all of these reasons, First Pres has received the enduring support of its members for 140 years. One can only imagine the early days – a small church with a modest building and perhaps a part time pastor. No office staff and no heating bills – just a coal stove. Local missions helping neighbors, or each other. No annual pledge drive – just generous weekly gifts when the plate was passed.

Fast forward to today – a full-time head pastor and a Pastor of Christian Discipleship, an office staff, a music program, child care, and a janitorial service. A Sunday School and Adult Bible Study. A 93-year-old building with ongoing maintenance needs, heating and cooling bills, and expensive insurance. And missions reaching out to our neighbors and the far corners of the world.

With so many of these expenses "baked in" to our operations, the annual pledge drive has become *a must* to let us know what our members are willing to support for the coming year. Strong pledges allow us to continue and grow. More modest pledges send the signal to trim our operations to live within our means.

For 2023, we are currently blessed with pledges *almost* covering our current expenses, the difference being made up from money in the bank from prior years' surpluses. We look forward to an even better 2024 – and with God's help, more than another 140 years of birthdays for First Pres. Happy Birthday!
